From Council - On behalf of the Council and Finance Committee, we want to extend a thank you to the congregation for your financial support during 2023. We are pleased to share that we exceeded our General Fund income budget by \$9,384 as well as exceeding Capital Improvement budget by \$1,423. We give the glory to God and are so thankful for our generous congregation!

Council News: The Facility Planning Committee presented their findings to Council on building space needs pertaining to continued forecasted growth of First CRC. The Council has approved their recommendation to have a conceptual design created utilizing the current property footprint to meet those needs.
